PHILIPPINES Pop. 107 Mil. Writing from England

We want to thank you all for your incredible support of us in these uncertain times. We are especially grateful that you continue to remember us in prayer. We had hoped to be back in Manila and considered using Jingle's Filipino citizenship and her elderly mother as an excuse. However, we listened to wise counsel that suggested we should be patient and wait until it is safe to travel again. In a country where health care is a privilege and not a right, panic sets in very quickly and our friends in Manila say they have been locked down again. Travel within the various areas of the capital city have been severely restricted. Only one person in each house is allowed out, and only for essential shopping. Jonathan has been able to continue teaching the believers in Manila via Zoom and encourage each of the men in the assembly individually, talking through particular issues they face. Jingle does something similar to encourage the sisters. Filipinos are an extremely social people who long for real fellowship together, so please pray that the Lord will encourage them and strengthen their hearts. Many are locked down with unsaved families that are hostile to the gospel. Pray that they will be preserved and also be a great witness for the Lord.
