### BRAZIL Pop. 214 Mil. UK 20 Writing from N Ireland

These past months have been most frustrating with so many restrictions. I came here to N. Ireland, to be with my wife, just as lockdown began last March, and never expected that over a year later, I would still be here in the UK. Thankfully, Christine continued to receive her treatment for cancer right throughout the pandemic, and I was on hand to help as needed.

Sadly, Brazil has been badly hit by the virus. Some days these past weeks, around 4,200 people were being called into eternity each day. In all, the number of deaths has passed 420,000 and government estimates are that this number will pass six hundred thousand by July! Some lovely believers have been called home and sadder still, some have died who listened to the Gospel often but never professed salvation. We can only hope that during the days in hospital before their death, they took advantage of the opportunity to get right with God and seek the Saviour.

Each weekend, since lockdown started, I have prepared messages in both ministry and the Gospel and sent them back to Brazil using WhatsApp. We continue to be encouraged in this work. Only in eternity will we know the full results, although we have heard of blessing in other parts. Each weekend 500 or more people listen to the Gospel message and many have never been to a Gospel Hall. Truly we can say with the apostle Paul 'the things that have happened... have fallen out unto the furtherance of the Gospel!' Phil 1:12.

I would value prayer that soon the covid situation in Brazil will improve. At the moment Brazil is on the UK Red list and this means travel is restricted and involves many problems. I would like to make another visit to Brazil soon if the Lord opens up the way.

Our God has all under His supreme control and we can await His hand in changing the present circumstances. "The Lord is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble, and He knows them that trust in Him" (Nahum 1:7).

### SOUTH AFRICA Pop. 58 Mil. UK 7 Cape Town

The financial implications of the last 12 months have been severe for many locals. By God's grace, and through the generosity of believers back in the UK, we have been able to pass on a little practical kindness to some of the believers most in need.

The last 12 months have been challenging for assemblies all over the world but especially for weaker assemblies in South Africa. At Northpine Gospel Hall we are gathering on a Sunday morning only. The believers are doing well but sadly we have experienced reduction in numbers due to death and also a family who left the assembly during lockdown. Generally speaking (with exceptions) the great needs among the assemblies in South Africa continue to be firstly, the raising up of divinely fitted leaders, and secondly, healthy teaching that nourishes the people of God. These great needs have been exacerbated during the last 12 months.

As well as challenges, the last 12 months have brought along unexpected opportunities. Many have listened to online Gospel messages and many believers have tuned in to teaching online. Quite a number of believers from denominations have been tuning into some of the online teaching. Please pray that it will challenge them on their associations and practice, as well as in relation to their walk with the Lord.

Please pray for Sanele who we got to know through children's meetings in a very poor area not far away. He is now 16 years old and living in another province but listening to online messages. He has a spiritual interest and reads his Bible but is not saved. Pray that some of these interactions will be used by the Lord to bring conviction and ultimately salvation.

Due to the reduction in Covid-19 numbers, the door has begun to open again for me to travel to encourage some of the assemblies further afield. Recently I was able to enjoy short series of ministry meetings with the saints at Wellington and Hermanus, who we have worked closely with for the last five years. These were happy reunions. Earlier this month I was also able to visit the saints at Bethel Assembly in Pretoria for a series of ministry. This involved a round trip of almost 1,800 miles and over 28 hours in the car. Providing we bring a few chairs there are a number who are willing to sit and listen at an impromptu Gospel meeting. Last week we met a lady called Irene when preaching in the open air. She is suffering from TB and wept as she heard the Gospel. Pray for her and others who listen that they will be gripped by the reality of eternity and the possibility of salvation in Christ.

### ANDAMAN & NICOBAR ISLANDS Pop. 0.4 Mil.

Here we are safe so far. Many suffered in different ways during this terrible situation of Covid but the Lord has remained in control and gratefully has protected the life of the believers. Thank you for your prayers.

Some may be unaware of where we are geographically. The Andaman and Nicobar islands is a union territory of India. It consists of 572 islands, of which 38 are inhabited. They sit at the junction of the Bay of Bengal and the Andaman Sea.

Here the assembly gatherings both at Bathubasti and Bambooflat are going on smoothly. No public ministry is possible as the covid rules are strict. There is a Bible study at Burmanalla. Please pray for these meetings.

Children's Bible clubs were suspended as most of the attendees are children whose parents are not believers. At the beginning of this month one group recommenced but now a second wave of corona is spreading. We are very worried about the future of this ministry among children. We are trying our best to keep in touch with some of them. Please pray for this ministry as many children have come to the Lord through this outreach.

Brothers Georgy Jacob, Deepak Kumar and Aby Joseph are working for the Lord with me here and are keeping well. The ministry at Great Nicobar Islands is going on well. I am always concerned about the work there as it is a pioneer work that is close to my heart. We are grateful to the Lord that there are now 3 assembly testimonies there.

After coming back from Kerala in mainland India, it has been a tough time for us as many of the believers became sick. Please pray for Pooja, daughter of brother Debo Brotho, as she is referred to the mainland for heart surgery. Brother Chamberlain is also waiting to be transferred to the mainland for kidney transplantation. They would both value your prayers.

Last November, Nicaragua and Honduras were hit by two hurricanes a week apart and they followed almost the same path. The destruction of so many people's lives was devastating. Honduras was hit hardest, and this included an area of the country where there are several assemblies and many Christians. Through the generous donations of many individuals and assemblies, we have been able to pass on help to those in need through the local leadership of several brethren with good testimonies. Assembly halls are being repaired, houses built for Christians who lost everything; beds, fridges, and stoves were bought for many. Praise God, we believe the overwhelming need has been met.

Here in Nicaragua, Bible calendars and food provisions were sent up the river 3 times to the Bosawás Rainforest where a young man that attends the assembly in Managua is originally from. Several years ago, we were able to visit this extremely isolated area of the country and share the Gospel there. We pray that the aid will give entrance to the Gospel in the hearts of many people! We hope to visit this area in June preaching Christ in several communities!

Fifty thousand calendars were printed locally and distributed through the 12 Nicaraguan Assemblies. We are thankful to

the many Christians who took calendars and in their own free time walked up and down the streets of their neighbourhood sharing the Good News with their neighbours. In the month of March, a family from Masaya who came nightly to the Gospel meetings were helped by building them a simple brick house. They previously lived in a structure built from whatever they could find. Please pray that Maria, Raul and their 5 children will trust Christ!

### SCOTLAND Pop. 5.5 Mil. Perth

As many of you will be aware, our life has been turned upside down since my diagnosis for bowel cancer. My first of three operations is due tomorrow (19th May). This is a loop ileostomy and will bypass where the tumour is. Once I have recovered sufficiently, I will then begin six weeks of radiotherapy and chemotherapy. It should take around twelve weeks to recover from both of these treatments. I will then undergo major abdominal surgery to remove the tumour, along with most of my left colon. Once recovered from this, it is likely there will be a further course of chemo followed by another operation to reconnect the bowel, if indeed that is possible.

If I think of all that lies ahead I just can't take it in. If all goes according to the medics schedule, it will take about a year to get through it all. Trying as the hymn says to take one day at a time. I have to confess that these days are a struggle, and knowing it is only going to get harder over the coming months is tough. Alison gave me a mug for my birthday recently that had an appropriate verse on it – 'Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go' (Joshua 1:9). What is also helping us all so much is the overwhelming love and care that we have been shown by our brothers and sisters in Christ. Thank you for your interest and prayers.

### INDIA Pop. 1,370 Mil. UK 3 Chennai

We take this opportunity to praise God for His continued faithfulness and for His guidance in every area of our work here.

We are writing specifically to ask you to pray for the country of India as you will be aware through the media that India is going through a terrible time because of the high increase in Covid cases. Every day there are about 400,000 new cases of the virus. The hospitals are absolutely full to their capacity and many patients are unable to get admitted, get proper treatment or even receive essential oxygen facilities. Sadly, many patients are kept in the ambulances at night to get a meagre oxygen supply.

The situation in our State is also worsening. Some of our own staff or their family members are also being infected. Yesterday, our pharmacist's mother suddenly passed away due to Covid. Vimala's brother, Mr Anburaj, a local pastor, was also admitted to the hospital. Sadly, he also died on 29 April but has gone to be with the Lord. We request your earnest prayers for the family and for his wife and two children during this sorrowful situation.

Three of our staff are recovering and three others are not well and in quarantine. Due to the high rise of cases in Chennai, and considering the safety of our staff, with effect from 3<sup>rd</sup> May we are shifting to 100% working from home for at least two weeks. Our Medical Floor will be functioning, with staff working on a shift basis.

Your prayers for us all at this very difficult time will be really valued.

### UKRAINE Pop. 44 Mil. UK 4 Lutsk

In Ukraine we are in the middle of two wars – military and medical! As we write there is a huge build up of military personnel and hardware on the Russian side of our border. More than 100,000 troops are reinforcing their advanced units. The Sea of

Azov and the Black Sea surrounding Ukraine have been closed to all shipping apart from Russian vessels for the next 6 months. These are worrying times!

Ukraine has the worst record in Europe of Covid infections at the present time. Also being the poorest country in Europe has not helped regarding procuring vaccines. The country is too poor to close down completely and so fatalities are extremely high. Medical staff are being stretched to the limit and many people are dying due to the lack of oxygen. Your prayers for both these situations are greatly appreciated.

Finally, we are aiming to get the Orphanage finished this year. The building covers 6 floors and is approximately 3,000 square metres. The new site to the left of the building has been registered in our names. We are grateful to the Lord. The local council have kindly given this to us, even although they could potentially have got a significant amount for it on the open market. By some reconfiguration of the area, we will no longer need to park vehicles in front of the orphanage, as there will be a paved parking area within the grounds. We look forward to seeing the home open for the glory of God, for the benefit of the Lutsk assembly testimony and for the Christian upbringing and salvation of poor Ukrainian orphans. ## ANGOLA Pop. 32 Mil. UK 4 Camundambala Update on the Angolan Literature Fund (ALF) Extracts taken from the 20th Annual Report

During 2020 a large amount of literature was sent to Angola. This included 20,000 hymnbooks, 8,000 bibles, 1,800 Portuguese study bibles, 2,000 Choice Gleanings daily reading books, 1,500 bible dictionaries and 7,000 bible commentaries and sound literature. In addition, 50,000 wall calendars in Chokwe, Portuguese, Luvale, Umbundu and Songo for free distribution plus 4,000 quarterly magazines (also free) and thousands of tracts were sent. Special thanks must be given to the Trinitarian Bible Society who freely granted us thousands of bibles for free distribution. Once again, we are indebted to Crawford Brown in Brazil who readily collates and orders for the ALF and informs us of new literature available.

The importation of 3 or 4 containers a year means much hard work. The paperwork and hour upon hour of mediating with customs and officials in Luanda is significant. To this end, the ALF could not operate without the patience, skill and understanding of brother Kaluiji in Luanda. His contribution to the work in Angola is enormous.

Please pray for the print rooms and book rooms in both Suarimo and Luanda. The Emmaus course work has restarted, with a number of the covers being redesigned. There are over 2,000 students doing these courses in Luanda and over 1,000 students in Saurimo. Pray for this really important work and all involved in it.

Finally a few additional prayer points. Please remember the local believers who have been severely affected economically during the pandemic. Pray that Angolan assemblies will remain true to biblical teaching regarding the local assembly. Pray for continued faithfulness among local workers. Also, please pray that containers will be delivered safely and to schedule.

### ENGLAND Pop. 56 Mil. Northampton Christian School Assembly Link Team (CSALT)

The CSALT team has been providing a valued service in supporting schools in Northamptonshire by conducting assemblies and religious education (RE) lessons for over 20 years. The majority of the 80 or so schools currently supported are Primary Schools.

Pandemic restrictions are now being relaxed and a few schools have invited us back in already. For this we give our great God thanks. Additionally contact has been made with a new school, whose headteacher knows us. I will be meeting her in due course to discuss our involvement there and prayer would be appreciated. In April 2021 our colleagues, Sandy Meikle and Mary Ratter brought a 5 week old baby to Lubumbashi with her parents to seek medical attention for a massive growth at the back of her head (which she was born with). Medical investigations in Lubumbashi including a CT scan, concluded that she would benefit from surgical intervention but that it would be at a cost of several thousand dollars if undertaken in Lubumbashi. This would be an extremely risky operation and unaffordable for the family.

David McAdam at Chitokoloki was contacted by Mary and he organised for the baby (Daniella) to be treated at the University Teaching Hospital in Lusaka, Zambia, at no cost to the family. As we already had a trip to the Copperbelt planned for the following week, we offered to take the family by car to Lusaka. Cue a

flurry of activity to obtain the necessary immigration documents and organise logistics, followed by a two day journey to Lusaka.

At the present moment, Daniella is doing well, having successfully come through two high risk operations. The family are residing at a guest house in Lusaka organised by the hospital. It is hoped that after a few weeks, if she continues to remain stable, the family will be able to be brought back to their home town of Dilolo.

The situation, whilst remaining very serious for Daniella and her parents has been an opportunity for various groups of God's people to work together, to help Daniella and ultimately glorify Him. From those who have prayed and sent practical support from afar, to those directly involved in DRC/Zambia, God's hand has been upon each step of Daniella's journey and it is our prayer that her situation continues to be used to bring glory to Him.
