PANAMA Pop. 4.2 Mil. UK 4

As we are emerging from two and half years of unprecedented global health issues, we are starting to see some return to normality. Here in Panama, we are about a year behind the rest of the world in relation to this return, but little by little its starting to come around. We are told that July 11th will be the beginning of "no masks" in stores or enclosed/inside areas, with some exceptions like hospitals and public transport. We hope that this will encourage people to return to a normal life without fear, that so much misinformation has produced.

This return to normality has also brought encouragement to assembly activities, outreaches, and attendance. We have recently seen an increase in the number of children attending the bible classes on Sunday as well as an outreach we have on Saturday mornings. Also, attendance at the assembly meetings has gradually increased and we are happy to see three new families attending with real spiritual interest in what the Bible teaches and not just "another man-made religion". This has been a breath of fresh air and it's a pleasure to open the scriptures with them and answer their questions and discuss new truths they've never heard before. One of them told us that in the place they attended before, supposedly evangelical, she'd never heard the gospel of God's salvation and that she needed to be saved! Its incredible how dark the darkness is!

We are reminded of what the Lord said in His review of the Church at Philadelphia, which was small, weak, but continued to be a faithful testimony and the Lord was guiding in opening and closing doors:

"I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name." Revelation 3:8

Since the pandemic hit us, we have lost 4 couples, who for reasons of employment had to leave us. Thankfully they are enjoying fellowship in other assemblies where they have moved to find work. Though small and weaker, we have seen the Lord's hand in blessing and encouragement.

For over two and a half years we have not been able to teach bible classes at the orphanage. It started with the pandemic, then seemed to turn into some internal disagreements in the administration that wouldn't allow us to go. We had spoken to an administrator a few times to see if we could return, but no positive reply was given. We found this strange for we had been helping there for over 11 years in various capacities and yet the door seemed to

be closed this time. Two weeks ago, one last email was sent to the director, who is very catholic, asking if it would be possible to have the classes again with the children. The reply was very positive, and he gave us a warm welcome and said we could have bible classes any time we wanted! The only explanation is that the Lord opened the door. So, we are planning to go this week to organize the classes. There is power in prayer!

We are also planning on drafting an application to take to the Ministry of Education to see if we can obtain permission again to get into the schools to give out Bible Texts, as we did before the pandemic. We would value prayer, as the minister who signed our last letter of permission is not there and we don't know how or if the new minister will view our application. We will wait until the end of July to do this, as we want the "July 11th no mask" policy to be in place so that there will be less reasons for them to reject the application, citing Covid restrictions.

ZAMBIA Pop. 18 Mil. UK 40 Loloma

We are quickly approaching the end of our first full year here in Zambia. There is much to rejoice about as well as many issues to pray about. Our God has been very gracious and kind to us, for which we are thankful. He has shown His protective hand and guidance along the way. We are currently waiting on the completion of registration for an NGO in Namibia. The country does not allow missionaries as such but will allow visas for residence through an NGO. Our aim is to set up a printing press to distribute gospel literature and have access to full time outreach in the country. In previous visits, the people of Namibia have been happy to receive gospel literature and are often willing to talk about the Lord Jesus Christ. We would appreciate prayers for full approval of the NGO as well as guidance for how to proceed and where to establish a base of operations in Namibia.

While we wait on the Lord about Namibia, we are active here in Manyinga. Every week there are a few men from local assemblies that get together, and we preach in the wards of the hospital in Loloma, or in the bush at different villages. After speaking the gospel, we are able to distribute the gospel of John in a few languages, normally Lunda, Luvale or English. This time is most insightful because we are able to talk and ask questions to each individual. The biggest 'plagues' that we must deal with are "good works for salvation" and "good works to keep salvation". We have been able to purchase a dirt bike for outreach purposes as well as visiting existing assemblies. We will be able to get deeper in the bush quicker with more literature than by walking, and access areas that would be more challenging to reach on four wheels. There are many cults, false prophets/healers, diviners, witch doctors, necromancers that have lots of sway over the people. Even the children of God are led astray.

ZAMBIA Pop. 18 Mil. UK 40 Loloma

On Tuesday afternoon we have an English bible hour with children from the area. The age group is 'under sixteen' and we see around 30 children on a regular basis. We sing songs, have messages and learn a verse for the week. Many of these young ones go home and repeat the message for their whole family. Later that evening I am able to have a bible study with some young adults. They attend all different types of churches from the area. We are

going verse by verse through the book of Galatians which has been most profitable. There are many teaching opportunities, and it is greatly needed. I am committed to three separate assemblies one Saturday a month each: Mukondoloki, Chipanda and Musole. Also, I was able to take up the Servant songs of Isaiah on the midweek meetings here in Loloma.

We have many challenges here because of inflation and lack of logistics. The two closest filling stations (one here in town and one a 30-minute drive from here, in Kabompo) have been out of diesel and petrol for the last month. The nearest filling station that might have fuel is Mufumbwe, which is a 2-hour drive from here. We have also seen a jump in maize pricing. A 50kg bag of maize was 120 kwacha last year: it is now 180 kwacha. This will help the farmers. In past years farmers have been selling their produce at a loss. The local people will feel the burden.

INDIA Pop. 1,370 Mil. UK 3 Siliguri (NE India)

More than two years have passed since the pandemic started. We are grateful to God for allowing us to go through many obstacles and enabling us to enjoy His grace. The sudden evolving of virtual meetings opened the door for us to communicate with saints from different parts of the world and hear the voice of our Lord through them. We are thankful to God for this new blessing. We are conscious of your continued prayer support for the ministry in this region and we thank you for the same.

The saints in Belgachi & Amjamni are in desperate need of help. We have been praying for the Lord to send a servant to live in this area and continue the ministry. Mr. Jonathan Hukkeri who was serving the Lord in Dhupguri has shifted to Siliguri. He is helping us in visiting these two assemblies and encouraging the believers. However, the need for someone to stay nearby this area and continue the work is strongly felt. A small piece of land was purchased recently in Amjamni to build a hall. Construction of the boundary wall is in progress.

For the past two years we were not able to conduct the camps. We are waiting on the Lord to guide us regarding next steps. These camps were very helpful in reaching students and their parents with the gospel.

In connection with the Salbari assembly, Aryan, one of our Sunday school students of early days was recently saved. He needs much prayer to grow in the Lord. We are praying for the salvation of his mother as well.

The Sunday school has started again and reasonable attendance is seen since last 6 weeks. Please pray for the teachers who are labouring among the children.

A sizeable number of students are finding it difficult to adjust to the classroom environment and have lost their interest in many important areas.

Two years ago we installed solar power units for the school. However due to the rising cost of energy, we are now planning to upgrade the units to double the power generation.

Please pray for brother and sister Rai as they are advancing in age and have health problems. They are also much burdened about the salvation of their two sons.

Since professional translators' charges are very high, we are in desperate need of English/Nepali translators to further our literature work.

The latest Angolan Literature Fund container arrived safely in Camundambala on the 24th July. A willing team of young men from the assembly helped to unload it early that morning.

Thank you for your prayers and now please give thanks for the safe sea journey, relatively rapid processing through the Luanda Port compared with recent experiences, and especially the safe 3-day road journey of nearly 1000KM to Camundambala. This journey is always dangerous due to the terrible roads but especially so during the current dry season when much of the road is deep sand with large deep potholes. We are so thankful to the Lord for this safe journey and, though not a believer, the always helpful and accommodating lorry driver Mauricio.

This container had 12,000 Portuguese Bibles, 2000 Hymnbooks, 2000 teaching magazines, 2000 commentaries by David Gooding, 20,000 Sunday School teaching booklets, consumables for the printing work as well as essential spares for the Land Rovers and generator plus building materials. May the Lord bless the distribution of all this literature.

The cost of sending containers is a matter of concern having nearly doubled over the last year due to increased global container transport costs and a greatly reduced Angolan exchange rate.

There are still quite a few cases of Covid around us, but it's not as severe as it used to be. So far, I have escaped although I've been fairly close to some who have had it. I did get vaccinated so that might have helped.

Prayer is requested for Clementsvale Assembly, that the Lord's people will be encouraged in seeing family members won for Christ and those who have grown cold in heart revived which could apply to most of us. Our eldest sister who turned 90 years old in March, had a fall at her sister's house and broke her hip and wrist. She was taken to Halifax Hospital where she got a half hip replacement the next day, which was something of a miracle at her age. She is now in Rehab and up walking with the aid of a walker, which isn't easy with one arm in a cast. She has some other underlying health issues, as well. She will go to her sister's home if and when she gets out. Emily may have a profession of

Salvation, but I don't think her husband does. Maybe Barbara's Testimony will result in their spiritual needs being addressed.

Brother Cress just turned 88 years old in June and never misses a meeting unless he's very ill. However, we've seen a decline in his health over these last few years. The Sunday School has resumed and although small beginnings, there are a few who have been coming on a regular basis. We give them a lunch in the basement afterwards which is appreciated, as food wouldn't be plentiful in some of these homes. The Lord often met the physical needs of the people as well as their spiritual needs. So we trust it will be used of the Spirit of God to bring them to repentance.

Many thanks for all your prayers for us as a family since coming here 41 years ago. We all need to be preserved and some of our grandchildren are still not saved. James is much missed in the whole Family Circle as well as in the assemblies ... but, "As for God, His way is perfect!"

In these last months, Ukraine has been to the foremost in International news. Like most, we follow daily reports with sadness and dismay having regularly visited various parts of the country. The loss of life, pain and suffering by so many, a result of war is heart-rendering. We pray that peace may soon be restored and families reunited, also for the missionaries, and full-time workers who seek to bring relief and comfort to so many! For many years we have worked alongside Norwegian brothers and sisters bringing relief, food, medical equipment, providing ambulances, clothing, establishing bible home groups, building and furnishing orphanages, etc. Because of the present situation, refugees have fled Ukraine, and a recent letter from our friends here in Norway with their permission I will share some of it with you.

"The first refugees came to Sevland west Norway on the 4th March. Later many who we had contact with in Ukraine also arrived. We have accommodated 35 in total, all age groups, the youngest 20 months, the oldest 68 years of age. Until the middle of May, believers opened their homes for accommodation, but now all have their own apartment and can live privately. Another 14 refugees were allocated to believers in Kopervik and also have their own apartment. Many believers on arrival of the refugees worked so hard to make them feel 'at home' as possible. Much of this work was arranged by the ladies in various assemblies and churches working together. What a wonderful testimony!

As a result of the love of Christ being exibited in a practical way, many of the refugees attend all the meetings and some have come to faith in the Lord Jesus."

In addition to this effort for the Lord, THK - Tro, Håp Kjærlighet (Faith Hope Love - in english) have sent since the 24th February 45 trailerloads of various urgent needs, medicine, hospital necessities and diverse food requirements especially for children. These are

all being co-ordinated by believers that we have full confidence in, and have known for many years. Please continue to pray for Ukraine, also for us in Norway and all involved in showing the love of the Lord in so many practical areas of service.

"And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also." 2 Timothy 2:2

The four-tiered idea that the Apostle Paul had in mind is the key for consolidation and continuation of the work of the Lord. As the work expands, passing on to others "all the counsel of God" becomes vital for the testimony and its continuation. In April we were invited to preach at the little assembly in Prizren, one of the main cities in Kosovo. During the Kosovo crisis and for almost 10 years after, believers mostly from the assemblies in Tirana and Italy laboured to sow the seed there and plant a work. When the resident missionary family returned discouraged to Albania in 2011, it appeared that the work had closed down and there was little in the way of contact. However, the Lord had not given up on the work! He stirred the heart of a young brother who had immigrated to Slovenia, firstly restoring him spiritually, saving his wife and bringing them back to Kosovo where they commenced meetings in their home. In due course a number were saved and baptised, and they started to function again as a little assembly. It was a unique experience to break bread with them and to remember the faithfulness of the Lord to His testimony in that city. B, along with his wife, is fully dedicated to serve the Lord and eager to bring the Gospel to other nearby villages. Over the last couple of years, we have been able to supply them with literature to use in outreach, for teaching within the assembly and for personal edification. The Children's Home - The Hiding Place - in Gjirokaster is currently at full capacity, with the latest additions joining in January. One of the twins has a hole in the heart requiring further

Thanks to those who continue to remember the children faithfully. The transition hasn't been easy for them, but the Lord has been giving the needed help. I was able to help brother Jonathan Goodwin with a concentrated spell of gospel open air and literature work on the streets of 26 towns in one visit recently. Over 40 Bible packs were distributed, 100s of pieces of literature and magazines were given out, numerous 'roadside texts' were postered, and most importantly, some excellent conversations were had about the good news of the gospel and also, in some cases, doctrinal questions discussed.

I still have the privilege of writing a gospel column in two nonchristian publications each month. This is an excellent way of getting gospel material into people's homes.

There are another three groups of believers gathering who are learning to meet in a biblical way. The assemblies which Sohail works among in Punjab, Pakistan, continue to grow. There were 3 when I was first introduced to them, whereas there are now 20. Despite this, they have other challenges and appreciate that we pray for them regularly.

The time has come for me to retire from teaching at the College in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. A replacement has been found to take the subjects which I have been teaching. He will start his duties in August this year, which is the beginning of the next semester for the college. I am the oldest lecturer at the college, turning 75 in January 2023. This means that after 28 years of teaching as an associate lecturer, it seems appropriate, for me to now hand over to the next generation, those activities which need to be carried on.

I came to Zimbabwe to engage in mission work in 1976. At that time there were a number of other missionaries here and I was guided by them and helped in the mission activities that they were involved in. There were missionaries from England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland, Australia, USA and South Africa. Over the years those missionaries have all left. Some of them went into retirement in other countries. I think that most of them have now gone to be with the Lord. I am now the last of our missionaries here.

This month, I have made a booking to go to Hwange National Game Park for the last few days of July, with 2 other friends, both of whom are members of the faculty at the college. This may be something of a farewell trip for me, going to this area which I have greatly enjoyed over the past thirty years. It is my expectation to be in the UK in August.

Food aid for the poor – orphans, widows and elderly, at the assembly here in Bulawayo continues to be given. But due largely to the pressures of covid over the past 2 years, our meals on Saturday have been a bit irregular. We seem to be cooking these

meals every 2 weeks now rather than weekly as before. Sometimes we have been able to supplement this meal by distributing food packs to help those on our list.

My wife, Sandra, died 15 years ago. Part of the work she was engaged in continues as the Sandra Jones Centre here in Bulawayo. I have not had any part in this work since Sandra died. It is a home for young women, most of whom have been subjected to abuse. There are also children there, most of whom have been birthed by the young women there. Please pray for all those involved.

We have recently returned from a month in Manaus. The Lord blessed our time there. Although both of us had ill health during the initial days, under the gracious hand of the Lord we were soon out and about meeting with the good contacts made last year - Several young people who had shown interest in the Word of God. We met them again and they were very happy to see us. Please pray especially for three of them: Emily, Philip and Lucas. We were there on the spot. Not too early, not too late. It was encouraging to meet the friends and children again who live in the same building. New friends interested in the Gospel have also been made. Remember in your prayers: Michele and her husband and children, also Simone and her husband and children. There will be quite a lot to keep us occupied when we return to Manaus soon DV.

BIBLE EDUCATION SERVICES (Extracts from BES Summer News)

The BES Summer newsletter focuses on Africa, with its encouraging reports mapping the development of Bibletime throughout this continent. Since 2012, BES has been able to make progress in countries where English is not the main language, supporting small teams to translate the Bibletime syllabus into their native language.

The global pandemic also gave translators more time to make significant progress. The reports show that over 2.6 million French Bibletime booklets 'Avec la Bible' are being used in Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chad, Central African Republic (CAR), DR Congo, Gabon, Ivory Coast and Mali. The team in Brazil worked hard to produce Bibletime in Portuguese 'Hora Bíblica' and these have been utilized in Angola and Mozambique. Hundreds of thousands of Swahili Bibletime booklets are being completed by children in Tanzania and translation has finished in Kikaonde and Bemba where the lower-level booklets are used in Zambia. Arabic (Middle East), Kinyarwanda (Rwanda), Oromo and Amharic (Ethiopia) are still progressing, and translations have begun in Chichewa (Malawi) and Congo Swahili. It is a great encouragement to see how Bibletime translation has made considerable advancement and we praise God for His continued provision of translators, designers, teachers and those who have a passion to reach the next generation with the Word of God.

Since we last reported on Africa in 2019, the spread of BES work has greatly increased, and we thank God for the tremendous help

given by Revival Movement as they print and ship 95% of the Bibletime booklets which are used in 24 African countries.

BES began a partnership with Southern African Literature Trust (SALT) in Malawi several years ago. In 2021, Stephen Harper and his team started a pilot project in Dzaleka Refugee Camp. There are over 50,000 people in the camp, most of whom speak Swahili. As Bibletime had already been translated into Swahili, they printed the courses locally and began using them. They have been a huge success and the children love having their own personal booklet. There is a school and orphan-care ministry at Dzaleka, called Christian Orphan Organisation in Malawi (COOM) overseen by William Iyango. Many of the 800 Swahili Bibletime booklets that were printed are being used in the school.

Anna Vallance, Wati, Harold and Goodson are part of the SALT team and several of them took part in a 2-day training seminar by BES in August 2021. Since then, they continue to go to the Dzaleka refugee camp once a month to see the Bible clubs, meet local teachers, help them work through any challenges that arise and build friendships. The teachers love the resources and the children's booklets because they are so comprehensive and easy to follow. Previously they had been choosing their lesson by randomly selecting a passage. The teachers note that they themselves are benefiting from spending time in God's Word each week as they prepare the lessons.

SALT have a vision to make the Bibletime material available to schools and after-school clubs across the entire country of Malawi. They are now in the process of translating the Bibletime syllabus into the national language of Chichewa, which is spoken by over 19 million people. Anna is also producing picture booklets from 'FreeBibleimages' to accompany the Bibletime syllabus so children and teachers have visual aids to help them learn. Please pray for these exciting developments, and for continued enthusiasm and persistence for the translation and proofing teams.

Life here in Brazil is practically back to normal. We all wear masks and take the necessary precautions still (at least most people do). Meetings in most assemblies are back to normal also. Tonight, all being well, I will be going to Porto Ferreira with Bill.
